

Ascension St. Francis Hospital

As a Ministry of the Catholic Church, Ascension St. Francis Hospital is a comprehensive behavioral



health center in Milwaukee that provides care across the continuum, from outpatient to partial hospitalization, and complete inpatient care for adolescents to adults. Ascension St. Francis Hospital is also Ascension Wisconsin's Inpatient Behavioral Health hub for SE Wisconsin, dedicated to compassionate and comprehensive care for mental health challenges. The multidisciplinary team of psychiatrists, therapists and nurses provides a safe, supportive environment with personalized treatment plans. Additionally, the hospital offers 24/7 emergency care, delivering care for life-threatening

injuries and illnesses and is an accredited Chest Pain Center and Primary Stroke Center, delivering advanced care as one of Milwaukee's advanced stroke centers.

Overview of the Implementation Strategy

Needs Prioritization

Included in Code Section 501(r)(3) is the requirement that hospitals must provide a description of the process and criteria used to determine the most significant health needs of the community identified through the CHNA, along with a description of the process and criteria used to determine the prioritized needs to be addressed by the hospital. Accordingly, Ascension St. Francis Hospital used a phased prioritization approach to identify the needs of the Milwaukee County community. The first step was to determine the broader set of identified needs. The CHNA assessment narrowed identified needs to a group of significant needs determined most crucial for community stakeholders to address.

After completing the CHNA assessment, significant needs were further narrowed down to prioritized needs that the hospital will address within the IS. To arrive at the prioritized needs, Ascension St. Francis Hospital used a process based upon the AHA Community Health Improvement's (ACHI) key components for prioritizing community health issues to identify the needs on which the hospitals would focus. Following the completion of the community health needs assessment, Ascension St. Francis Hospital leadership and stakeholders considered the following criteria in choosing the significant needs:

- Scope of problem
- Health disparities
- Feasibility



- Momentum/commitment
- Alignment

Needs That Will Be Addressed

Following the completion of the current CHNA, Ascension St. Francis Hospital in collaboration with leadership from other Ascension hospitals in Milwaukee has selected the prioritized needs outlined below for its 2024 IS. Ascension has defined "prioritized needs" as the significant needs that the hospital has prioritized to address through the three-year CHNA cycle:

- Mental health was prioritized due to its increasing challenges and strong community demand
 for support. Mental health disorders affect thinking, emotions, relationships, and daily life, and
 are linked to higher rates of smoking, inactivity, obesity, and substance misuse. These issues
 contribute to chronic illness, disability, overdose, and suicide. Given the close link between
 mental health and substance misuse, both will be addressed together in the Community Health
 Needs Assessment (CHNA). Ascension Wisconsin hospitals are dedicated to expanding access
 to mental health and addiction services within their facilities and the broader community.
- Access to Care was identified as a priority due to its vital role in supporting physical, mental, and social health. Community members expressed the need for improved access to various types of medical services. Ascension Wisconsin is committed to enhancing all aspects of care access—including affordability, geographic availability, and culturally competent, trustworthy providers. As a Catholic healthcare system, ensuring care for all individuals, regardless of their ability to pay, is a core mission of Ascension Wisconsin.
- Chronic Conditions were chosen as a priority due to the importance of prevention in building a
 healthier community. Residents highlighted the link between chronic diseases and overall
 wellbeing. Effective treatment and management can improve quality of life, while healthy
 lifestyles—supported by access to nutritious food, physical activity, and stress reduction—can
 lower disease risk and reduce reliance on medication. This priority emphasizes support for
 communities disproportionately impacted by structural barriers to healthy living.

Ascension St. Francis Hospital understands the importance of all the community's health needs. It is committed to playing an active role in improving the health of the people in the communities it serves. For this implementation strategy, Ascension St. Francis Hospital has focused its efforts on the above priorities.

Needs That Will Not Be Addressed

Ascension St. Francis Hospital



Based on the prioritization criteria, the health needs identified through the CHNA that Ascension St. Francis Hospital does not plan to address at this time include:

- Substance Misuse was not selected in this CHNA cycle as a stand alone priority. Ascension St.
 Francis Hospital will focus efforts incorporated under the Mental Health priority as these issues are often interrelated.
- Maternal and Child Health was not selected as a separate priority because Ascension St.
 Francis Hospital already places a strong emphasis on improving outcomes. This includes access to care, high-quality clinical services, and family support. Maternal health will instead be addressed through existing priorities such as healthcare access, mental health, and social support. The hospital will continue partnering with community organizations to advance maternal and child health outcomes.
- Economic Stability was not selected as a standalone priority, but Ascension St. Francis Hospital
 recognizes its strong connection to chronic conditions and mental health. Factors such as
 housing, access to healthy foods and opportunities for physical activity impact overall health.
 These economic influences will be addressed through the hospital's efforts to prevent and
 improve chronic conditions and mental health support.
- Healthy Living was not selected as a standalone priority; however, Ascension St. Francis
 Hospital understands the interconnection between healthy living and chronic conditions.
 Ascension St. Francis Hospital will consider how to support healthy living such as access to
 healthy foods, physical activity and healthy weight in addressing chronic conditions, particularly
 for populations with limited opportunities to engage in healthy living.
- Community Safety was not selected because Ascension St. Francis Hospital understands that
 community safety is a complex social issue requiring a systems approach led by experts in
 these respective areas. Ascension St. Francis Hospital also understands the relationship
 between mental health, substance misuse and exposure to community violence, therefore, the
 hospital will continue to seek future opportunities and develop partnerships to support and
 promote community safety.

While these needs are not the focus of this Implementation Strategy, Ascension St. Francis Hospital may consider investing resources in these areas as appropriate, depending on opportunities to leverage organizational assets in partnership with local communities and organizations. Also, this report only encompasses a partial inventory of everything Ascension St. Francis Hospital does to support health within the community.

Approval and Adoption of the IS by Ascension St. Francis Hospital, Inc. Board of Directors

To ensure the Ascension St. Francis Hospital efforts meet the needs of the community and have a lasting and meaningful impact, the TY2024 Implementation Strategy was presented and adopted by the Ascension St. Francis Hospital, Inc. Board of Directors on October 29, 2025. Although an authorized body of the hospital must adopt the IS to be compliant with the provisions of the Affordable Care Act, adoption of the IS also demonstrates that the board is aware of the IS, endorses the priorities identified, and supports the action plans that have been developed to address prioritized needs.

Action Plans

The IS below is based on prioritized needs from the hospital's most recent CHNA. These strategies and action plans represent where the hospital will focus its community efforts over the next three years.



STRATEGY #1: Behavioral Health Care and Promotion

Hospital - Ascension St. Francis Hospital

Prioritized Health Need #1 - Mental Health

Objective

By the end of the three year IS cycle, Ascension St. Francis Hospital will have;

- 1. increased the number of individuals receiving needed mental/behavioral health care in Ascension clinical settings and in the community
- 2. increased their outreach efforts by supporting community-based organizations (CBO) which support mental health prevention and promote mental well-being

Baseline for this metric will be established

Strategy

Decrease behavioral health stigma and increase access to mental health and substance misuse clinical care both within the healthcare setting and within the community

Prioritized Health Need #2 - Access to Care

Objective

By the end of the three year cycle, Ascension St. Francis Hospital will increase the number of individuals who are connected and engaged in primary health care and have access to other needed health care services.

Strategy

Increase access to primary care and other health care services both within the healthcare setting and within the community

- 2. Ascension St. Francis Hospital will increase support for those patients who have one or more chronic conditions.

Promote/enhance access to nutritious foods to support overall health, prevent chronic conditions, and provide ongoing support for individuals living with chronic illnesses
