2019 PUBLIC REPORTING

St. Vincent Indianapolis Cancer Care Community Outreach and Screening Services provides screening mammograms, skin screenings, lung scans, head and neck screenings, gynecologic exams and colon screenings, as well as cancer education, across Central Indiana.

Interactive workshops and presentations, designed to educate the community about the importance of the early detection of cancer, are customized to fit the needs of each individual group, business or community event.

Men and women are educated on health topics related to prevention, early detection, cancer risk factors, common symptoms of various cancer types, types of screenings, diet and exercise.

This program also provides on-site mammograms for multiple businesses and community partners, providing ease of access for working women and free mammograms for those women who are uninsured, underinsured or facing high deductible.

For the timeframe of October 1, 2018 to September 30, 2019, the mobile screening unit has provided a total of 2,978 mammograms and 30 clinical breast exams. This number includes 422 free mammograms to uninsured and underinsured women through collaboration with local community partners, which include
