Prior to surgery

- A nurse from the presurgical testing department will contact you prior to your surgery and will review the following:
 - Health history
 - Anesthesiology
 - Appointment verification for pre-operative tests
 - Medication instructions
 - Do's and Don'ts
- Your pre-registration call will cover:
 - Full legal name and address
 - Driver's license number
 - Marital status
 - SS#
 - Insurance
 - Employer
 - Emergency contact
- Obtain medical clearance
- Take lab tests
- Start pre-operative exercises as directed



Pre-operative exercises

- Start pre-operative exercises prior to surgery
 - 9 exercises for hip
 - 10 exercises for knee
 - See Understanding Joint Replacement Pre & Post-Operative Exercises document
- Pre-operative exercises will help prepare you for surgery
- Continue other activities if approved by your doctor



Stop smoking

- It's recommended that you stop smoking prior to surgery to ensure a good healing process
- Quitting smoking is one of the most critical things you can do in preparation for your surgery



Stop taking certain medications

- Stop taking the following medications prior to surgery as directed by your pre-surgical nurse:
 - Aspirin
 - Ibuprofen (Motrin)
 - Naproxen (Aleve)
 - Vitamin E
 - Herbal supplements



Prepare your home and set up transportation

- Prepare your home and set up transportation prior to surgery
 - Put frequently used items within reach
 - Remove items on floor (rugs, cords, etc.) to prevent falls
 - Add night lights to prevent falls
 - Prepare and freeze healthy meals, especially high protein food with lots of fruits and vegetables
 - Enlist help from your support person for the following:
 - Laundry
 - Collecting mail
 - Pet care
 - Yard work
 - Set up transportation to and from physical therapy and follow-up appointments



Day before surgery

- You'll receive a call from the hospital the day before your surgery to verify surgical time
 - Usually the call is made later in the afternoon
- If your surgery is scheduled for a Monday, you should expect to receive a call on Friday



Night before surgery

- The night before your surgery:
 - Don't eat or drink after midnight
 - Follow your doctor's instructions regarding:
 - Medications
 - Skin care
 - Showering



What to pack

- Pack the following items the night before your surgery:
 - Tennis shoes
 - Medications
 - C-PAP if you use one
 - Cell phone or tablet
 - Copy of advanced directives (if applicable)
 - Insurance card
 - Driver's license/photo ID
