Temporary visitor guidelines: COVID-19

Visitor limitations within all Ascension care settings are necessary for the safety of our patients, visitors, care teams and community to control the spread of Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).

What visitors need to know before entering:

- Waiting rooms are currently closed to visitors with the exception of:
 Visitors accompanying a patient under the age of 18 or
 Visitors accompanying patients with disabilities or impairments or who are elderly
- **Emergency Room patient visitors** are limited to one (1) per patient at any given time and must stay in the patient room.
- Surgery or procedure patient visitors are limited to one (1) per patient. Visitors will be required to wait outside of the building once the patient is moved into surgery.
- **Non-COVID-19 patient visitors** are limited to two (2) visitors per patient at any given time.
- **COVID-19 patient visitors** are limited to one (1) per patient at any given time.
- If a patient without a disability is currently in the COVID ICU, visitors will not be allowed unless deemed necessary by nursing and physician staff.
- Visitors will be required to complete a screening for entry.
- Visiting hours may vary, please ask the care team.
- It is highly recommended that visitors are at least 18 years old.

What visitors need to do once cleared for entry:

- Must wear a mask and practice social distancing while in the patient room and any area of the facility.
- Must stay in the patient room or designated area limit going to other areas in the hospital.
- Must wash your hands and use hand sanitizer before and after your visit.
